# Assembly District 78 Fourth Grade Art Contest: California State Symbols - Celebrating California's Icons

## **Objective:**

Create an art piece that showcases the unique state symbols or themes of California and highlights their significance in the Golden State's history and culture.

# **Materials Needed:**

- 18" x 11" maximum poster paper, cardboard, or other flat material.
- Art materials (markers, paint, glue, crayons, etc.)
  - Natural materials like leaves, sand, and feathers are encouraged, but please stay below 1
     lb. weight for mailing purposes.
- Reference materials about California state symbols (books, printouts, online resources)

## **Project Requirements:**

- Ensure the project weighs less than 1 lb. and can fit in a manila envelope for mailing purposes.
- Student's name, teacher, school, and parent's phone number should be TYPED and clearly visible on the back of the project. Please feel free to use the attached example to format your name and contact information.

#### **Instructions:**

- Research:
  - Use reference materials to learn more about each state symbol, and pick one or more to inspire your project. Understand their characteristics, significance, and why they were chosen to represent California.
- Brainstorming:
  - Think about how you can creatively represent your chosen symbol(s) in your artwork.
  - Consider colors, shapes, and arrangements that capture the essence and importance of your chosen symbol(s).
- Sketching:
  - Begin by sketching your ideas on paper. Experiment with different layouts to find the best way to showcase the significance and history of the symbol(s).
- Art Creation:
  - Once you are satisfied with your sketches, start creating your final art piece. Use your
    chosen materials to add color, texture, and details to bring your representation of
    California's state symbols to life.
  - Include your typed name, school, parent's phone number, and a short description (2-4 sentences) of your art piece. This should be glued on the back of the art piece.
